## What Kind of Issues Do We Study?

We tackle issues at all three levels of government. In recent years League members have delved into these concerns:

### Health Care

What kind of reform is needed at the national level? How should it be financed?

### Preschool Education

What role should government play in providing quality child care?

### Taxes

Should Florida implement a state income tax?

### Public Schools

How much local control should be granted by the state?

### Florida's Constitution

By what process should citizens be able to put proposed amendments on the ballot?

### Water

What is the quality of Volusia County's water? Is our water supply adequate?

## How Do We Serve Volusia County?

### Voter Service

Prior to elections we moderate live and televised candidate debates and forums.

### Voter Registration

League members help register voters at locations throughout the county.

### Voters Guide

We publish a free directory of elected officials and distribute thousands of copies countywide.

### Citizen Information

Before elections, we provide speakers to explain the pros and cons of ballot issues.

### Election Monitoring

Because we are known to be nonpartisan, we are asked to monitor the elections of other organizations.

### Service on Advisory Boards

Because League members are conversant on public policy issues, we are often appointed to local and state committees and commissions.
